## What is **Cyberbullying?**

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place using electronic technology such as social media, video gaming, chat rooms, instant messaging, and all other forms of digital electronic communication. Technology is constantly changing and can be an exciting avenue for students to explore. Nevertheless, it also promotes constant online interaction with others which can increase the likelihood of one's exposure to cyberbullying behavior.
